

Dr. Young-Key Kim-Renaud is Professor Emeritus of Korean Language and Culture and International Affairs, and Senior Advisor to the Institute for Korean Studies at George Washington University, where she taught for 32 years and served as Chair of the East Asian Languages and Literatures Department for the last 12 years of her tenure before retiring in 2015. As a pioneer in Teaching Korean as a Foreign Language and in Korean Linguistics, she has published 13 books and numerous articles on Korean linguistics and Korean humanities. She served as President of the International Circle of Korean Linguistics (1990-92) and as Editor-in-Chief of its journal, *Korean Linguistics* (2002-14). Organizer of major cultural and academic events, she is the recipient of prestigious grants and prizes including three Fulbright awards, the Republic of Korea Order of Cultural Merit, and the Samsung Bichumi Award (Women of the Year) in Korea.
