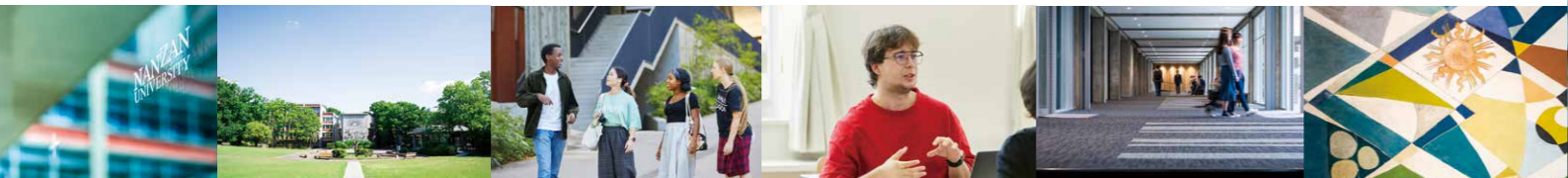

POINT 03

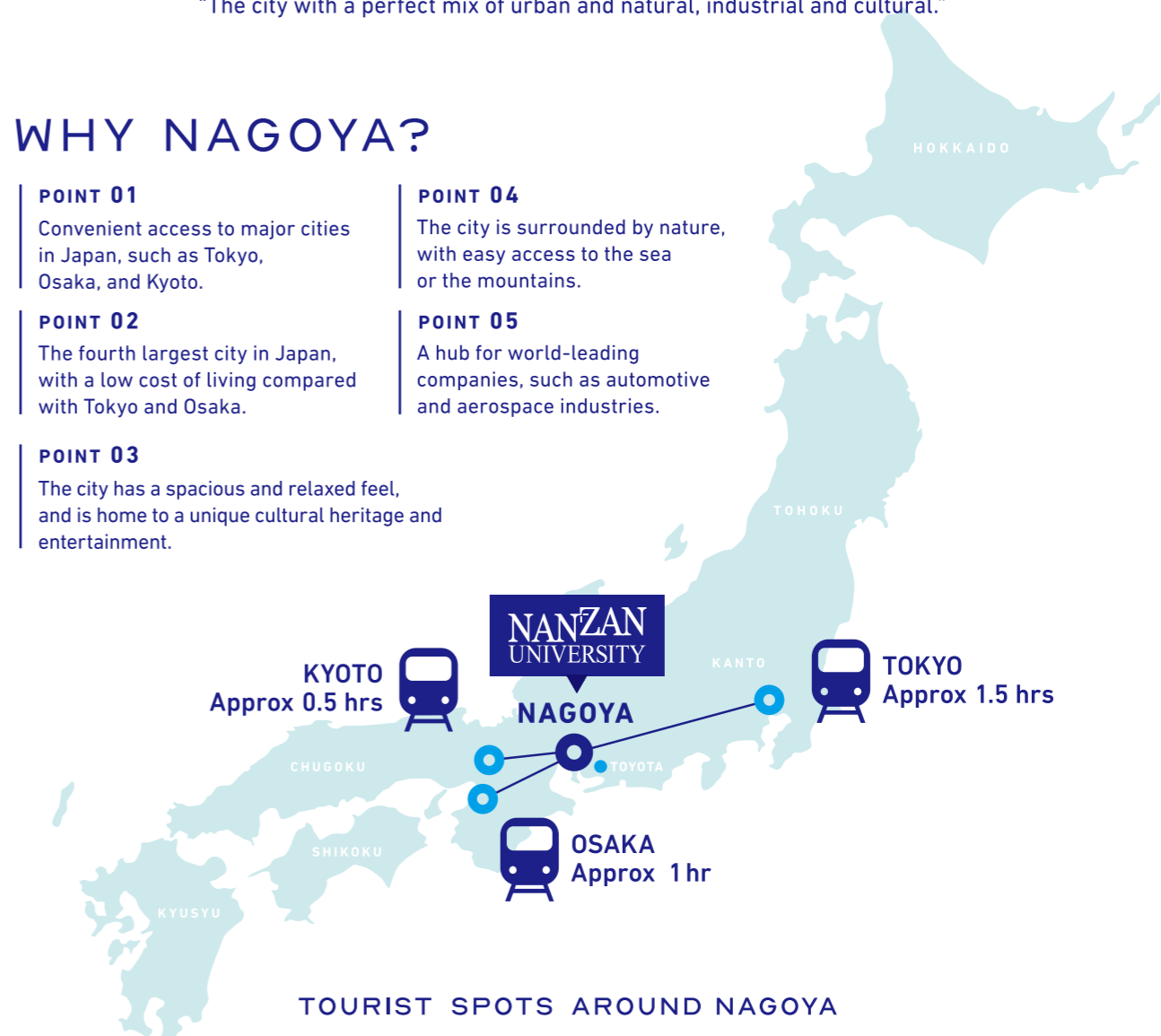
The city has a spacious and relaxed feel, and is home to a unique cultural heritage and entertainment.
